LENT GUIDE

A Focus on Scripture, Prayer, and Fasting During the Season of Lent

WHAT IS LENT?

"Lent is the season on the church calendar that comes just before Easter. It is 40 days long (if you don't count the Sundays, which are seen as "little easters.") While there are many ways that Lent is described & observed, it is typically in preparation for Easter with a focus on fasting & meditating on the suffering of Jesus." -Justin Whitmel Earley

For the purposes of Prayer and Fasting, we will highlight and practice three spiritual practices during Lent.

Step 1: Get participation with your Parish.

Follow up with your neighborhood parish and share what Prayer and Fasting Practices you will do during Lent.

Step 2: Review the Practices

Get familiar with the Prayer and Fasting practices and place them on a calendar so you can visualize the days and weeks during Lent. Calendar template below.

Step 3: Embrace Community and Failure

Two of the main lessons is that the good life is the communal life, and that anything worth trying is hard and involves failure. This includes following Jesus. As for community, your parish meets every week to share experiences and pray. As for failure, you should remind each other that the goal is not to check off some habits, but to fail together, experience grace, learn and become formed more in the Gospel of Jesus.

Lent Pledge: I, _____, will pursue the grace of Jesus to practice these Prayer and Fasting practices through the Lent season of 2023 in hopes of continuing these habits after Easter Sunday.

I commit to practicing some, if not all, of these habits such as:
1) reading Scripture before phone,
2) kneeling prayer at morning and bedtime, and
3) fasting from certain meals and certain comforts.

1. DAILY SCRIPTURE READING BEFORE PHONE

"Refusing to check the phone until after reading a passage of Scripture is a way of replacing the question, 'What do I need to do today?' with a better one, 'Who am I and who am I becoming?' Daily immersion in the Scriptures resists the anxiety of emails, the anger of the news, and the envy of social media. Instead it forms us daily in our true identity as children of the King, dearly beloved." -Justin Whitmel Earley

2: KNEELING PRAYER AT MORNING & BEDTIME

"The world is made of words. Even small, repeated words have power... By framing our day in the words of prayer, we frame the day in love... Kneeling marks the moment with physicality and humility. If this is difficult to do, try gently turning up your palms, setting them on your knees, or walking to a window to pray." -Justin Whitmel Earley

• Morning: "God, I was made for your presence. May this day be one I spend with you in all that I do. Amen."

• Bedtime: "Father, I was made to rest in your love. May my body rest in sleep, and may my mind rest in your love. Amen."

A) Pray the A.C.T.S. method for 5-10 minutes. Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication.

3. FAST FROM FOOD/COMFORT.

"We constantly seek to fill our emptiness with food and other comforts. We ignore our soul and our neighbor's need by medicating with food and drink. Regular fasting exposes who we really are, reminds us of how broken the world is, and draws our eyes to how Jesus is redeeming all things." -Justin Whitmel Earley

1. An **Absolute Food Fast** is where you abstain from all food and all water for a certain period of time.

2. A **Solid Food Fast** is where you may drink juice and water, but choose not to eat solid food.

3. A *Partial Food Fast* is where you can choose to abstain from certain foods and drinks instead of complete abstinence.

Fasting Examples:

-Fast from Meals and use that time to feast on prayer or Bible reading.

4. A **Comfort Fast** is where you choose to abstain from a certain comfort that distracts you from prayer and Bible reading.

Fasting Examples:

-Fast from TV Shows and Movies and use that time to feast on on prayer or Bible reading.

-Fast from Social Media and use that time to feast on Confession and Assurance of Forgiveness prayers.

-Fast from types of music and replaces it by feasting on listening to the Bible. -Fast from one hour of sleep to wake up one hour earlier the next day and journal prayers of thanksgiving.
